Purpose: To hear comments regarding the proposed fee increase and to ex-

plain the reasons for the proposed increase.

The District intends to increase the residential base fee to \$19.00 per month; the monthly fee charged to a trailer home will increase to \$15.50; and the increase to commercial, industrial and other sewer service fees will be \$19.00 per month per equivalent residential unit. The extraterritorial service fee (the fee charged for service to property located outside the District which does not pay property taxes to the District) will be double the fee that would be charged if the property were located within the District's boundary. Excess water charges will increase to \$1.13 per 1,000 gallons.

South Davis Sewer District PROPOSED 2022 FEE INCREASE

Comments

The South Davis Sewer District owns, operates and maintains two wastewater treatment plants along with a system of underground piping called a collection system that consists of approximately 380 miles of pipe and almost 9,000 manholes. It is critical that the District's facilities and treatment processes are adequately maintained and keep pace with new regulatory requirements, emerging contaminants of concern and a growing population.

The 2022 fee increase is driven by new nutrient limits mandated by the Utah Division of Water Quality (DWQ) for nitrogen and phosphorus. These limits require the District to construct new treatment technologies to achieve adequate nutrient removal not possible using its current wastewater treatment processes. These new technologies will also address more stringent ammonia limits imposed on the District by DWQ.

The District is committed to providing the best service to District residents for the least possible cost and adjusts fees only as needed to match the cost of service resulting from required expansion and rehabilitation.
